Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) 7th July 2024 Rejected Prophet

Readings: Ezekiel 2:2-5 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 Mark 6:1-6

"Where did this man get all these?" This is a hard teaching, who can accept it? Who is Jesus? His kinfolk in Nazareth might know Him as the carpenter, the son of Mary, but they do not know Jesus, the Son of God. God empowers Ezekiel, the prophet to speak to the rebellious people of Israel. This shows that God will make His presence known even if people do not listen. Jesus is only able to heal a few sick people in Nazareth because of their unbelief. This highlights the importance of having faith in God's power to heal and help us.

God tells Ezekiel that the people will know a prophet has been among them whether they listen or not. We all have a prophetic call and mission from God. The question is, where is this mission, and how do we begin it? There is a mission everywhere today. There is a prophetic mission in our families, communities, streets, workplaces, schools, and the world at large. God saw this same fear in Jeremiah and said to him: "Get ready, Jeremiah; go and tell them everything I command you. Do not be afraid of them or I will make you even more afraid of them".

The Lord instructs the prophet that he is to stand by his message even though it will meet with rejection. The message will be vindicated in due course. The episode shows that the greatest enemy to faith can simply be familiarity. The expression "familiarity breeds contempt" expresses the idea. We take them for granted and can be blind to their good qualities. We lose a sense of wonder. I am here to do what God wants. Are we able to see the presence of God in others and be able to recognize that God speaks through others? Do we see and acknowledge the prophets of our own time?

A true prophet in our Christian tradition must reflect both the Holy Scriptures and the Church: faithfulness to God's word revealed in Holy Scripture, love for God, love for others, care for the needy and the oppressed. What matters is that the prophet speaks the word of God. Today God invites us to listen to the prophets.

Ezekiel suffered rejection because he predicted the destruction of Jerusalem. Nevertheless, Ezekiel is empowered by the Spirit and mandated by the Lord to continue proclaiming his word to the people, 'whether they listen or not'. We should surely be grateful to St Paul for the frankness with which he acknowledged the "thorn in the flesh" that remained despite all his pleadings with God to take it away. Whatever it was, the "thorn" that God would not take away became a key aspect of his spirituality and sense of God's grace.

Jesus' encounter with His own kin in His own town was disappointing. They were amazed at His wisdom and the mighty deeds He performed. But despite this amazement at Him they "took offense at Him." They took offense because they didn't understand how one of their own kin could be someone special. We realise that it is not easy to be a prophet. Often those to whom God's word is addressed to are not ready to listen. God's word challenges and invites us to change; change, that is never easy.

Bearing in mind that the Decrees have yet to be officially approved by the Apostolic See, these actions will be practical and able to be implemented immediately.
