# Renew the Face of the Earth

World Environment Day, commemorated each year on the 5 June, is about raising awareness and taking action on critical environmental issues. It serves as a reminder of our collective responsibility to protect and preserve the planet we call home.

In 2024, the focus is on land restoration with the reversal of desertification and building drought resilience, under the slogan "Our Land. Our Future". All generations are called to be #GenerationRestoration".

Through land clearing for agricultural farming, logging for products such as timber and paper, urban expansion, and infrastructure development, humans are destroying forests at the alarming rate of 10 million hectares per year or, in everyday terms, at a rate equivalent to 27 soccer fields per minute. (*Earth.org*) Land restoration means ecosystems are revived, and animal and plant habitats are rejuvenated. Worldwide this requires fierce resolve on the part of governments, business, agriculture sector, community groups and individuals to tackle land restoration in a multitude of ways. Importantly, the causes of land degradation, drought and desertification, such as unchecked development and consumerism and climate change drivers must be tackled. Last year, temperatures records were shattered. Much of the world felt the impacts, not just in heat stress but with the intensity and frequency of severe storms, floods and drought. Restoring land without tackling climate change would be like giving with one hand and taking away with the other.

A call to commitment and action comes with this following realisation: I said somebody should do something, then I realised I was somebody. Each of us is called to action and the call comes from God himself. In Genesis2 our duty to be custodians of the earth is clearly outlined: "God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it." The Hebrew word for keep is 'shamar' and it means 'to guard or watch over and protect.' Pope Francis in his beautiful encyclical Laudato Si exhorts us "to be protectors of God's handiwork, which is essential to a life of virture...not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience" (#217). The example of land stewardship from our Indigenous Australians is also acknowledged and provides powerful models of 'caring for country'.

Being part of Generation Restoration means each of us takes up the challenge to protect and restore our ecosystems, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and promote sustainable practices in everyday aspects of our lives. The simple, restorative action of planting a tree or shrub is one potent way to partake in land restoration. Trees are generous with abundant benefits that preserve, enrich and sustain the planet and our lives in immeasurable ways. Trees filter the air we breathe, mitigate the effects of climate change by absorbing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, prevent soil erosion, slow water evaporation, provide food and medicines, cool and shade, building materials, homes for many species of insects, birds and mammals and much more. The health benefits, both physical and mental, of trees for humanity is both massive and matchless. The proverb "The best time to plant a tree is 20 years ago. The second-best time is now." is certainly compelling.

## FAITH MATTERS: Are You Ready?

Jesus said no-one but the Father knows the hour, but there would be signs of the times.

Is death scary to you? Why?

If you were told you had to pledge allegiance to a system that openly denies God, or die, what would you choose?

Is your care for someone or something else in this world such that your desire to preserve them would override your allegiance to God and the ways of God?

In other words, do you really believe that God has everyone's very best interests at heart, such that you will choose to hold fast to God, even when everything seems to be working out in an evil way?

Have you really, REALLY, looked deeply into the immensity of the sacrifice Jesus-God made for YOU, and for all who would accept the gift, to wipe away our debt of sin? Recognising the astonishingly humble Love in that sacrifice, made by the Supreme God who created everything, is the basis for a truly strong faith.

When Jesus returned to Heaven, the disciples thought that Jesus' second coming would be in their lifetime. God, however, gives each person, and the world as a whole, generous time to choose what is good, and only carries out drastic judgment when the majority of people practise serious evil, and the situation will only worsen if God does not intervene. Look at Abraham's plea for Sodom and Gomorrah. Also, God did not wipe out the peoples of the Promised Land until their sins were "full".
