Pentecost Sunday (Year B)

19th May 2024

Readings: Acts 2:1-11 Galatians 5:16-25 John 15:26-27, 16:12-15

Pentecost Sunday and 50 Years of Thanking the Lord (1974-2024)

"Church is a group of people moved and inspired by the Holy Spirit and it cannot go unnoticed in this world. At Pentecost, it is this same divine life force that recreates the frightened group of disciples into bold proclaimers of the Gospel. And they came out to speak to a multitude of people speaking different languages and all of them heard what the disciples spoke in their own language: the curse of the Tower Babel is reversed because it was the Spirit that was speaking through them. The symbols of divine presence described in Acts 2 are familiar from the Old Testament: thundering noise as God's manifestation at Sinai; the whirlwind, like that from which God spoke to Job; and flames of fire, such as Moses saw at Mount Horeb.

Pentecost Sunday is the climax of Easter celebrations. It is often referred to as the birthday of the Church and his gospel of love and forgiveness. The readings today remind us of three important truths about the Church and its mission: first, the Church is missionary; second, the Holy Spirit is the principal agent of Mission; and third, the goal of mission is to create a unity that embraces diversity. Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room. A "strong, driving" wind filled the room where they were gathered, and tongues of fire came to rest on their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so that they could understand each other. It was such a strange phenomenon that some people thought the Christians were just drunk — but Peter pointed out that it was only the morning, and said the phenomenon was caused by the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission — to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations. It fulfills the New Testament promise from Christ that the Apostles would be "clothed with power" before they would be sent out to spread the Gospel.

FAITH MATTERS: The Significance of Pentecost

But is that all that really happened on that day? We have a description of the physical events of the day, but there is much more to Pentecost than that. Pentecost is a day that is nearly as significant to Christianity as Good Friday and Easter. On those latter two days, we celebrate the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. Events that enable the forgiveness of our sin and victory over death, but without Pentecost that work is unfinished.

On the eve of Jesus' betrayal and arrest, he spent the evening teaching his disciples. And a significant portion of that instruction concerned the Paraclete/Counselor/Comforter/Advocate that he would send to them, the Holy Spirit. This promise was fulfilled less than two months later at Pentecost. Christ sent the Holy Spirit to his followers. Not just to their leaders or to the most faithful, but the Holy Spirit came to all of them. The Holy Spirit came to stay, taking up permanent residence in each believer. And not just the believers at Pentecost, but all believers from then on.

This week we have two feast days to honour Our Lady: The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church - 20th May

Celebrated on the Monday after Pentecost, which is considered the 'birthday of the Church'. Commemorates Mary's motherhood of the Church, rather than Mary as Mother of God (January 1). Ancient roots in Catholic tradition dating back to Augustine and Leo and Great. Inscribed into the General Roman Calendar by Pope Francis in 2018.

Our Lady, Help of Christians - 24th May

The Virgin Mary has often been invoked in times of religious strife under the title of Help of Christians. In thanksgiving for the release of Pope Pius VII from captivity in 1814, the feast was established the following year on the anniversary of his restoration. The first Australian provincial synod held in Sydney in 1844 placed the Church in Australia under Mary's patronage invoked by the title Help of Christians. The solemn feast is an occasion to seek Mary's help and protection for our Church and nation.
