Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

23rd June 2024

Readings: Job 38:1, 8-11 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 Mark 4:35-41

"Do you not care that we are perishing?

The Book of Job that deeply touches one's heart urges us to stick to our faith in God at any cost and evokes at the same time great sympathy for the suffering man. The Book of Job contains a riveting account of all that happens to Job and his struggle to keep his faith in God, despite all the odds against it. His wife and three friends, seeing him in great suffering, advise Job to curse God and die. But nobody and nothing could move Job to speak against God, his Creator.

We need people to at least read once all the chapters of the Book of Job without long breaks in between. This one book can take each of us through the experiences of our life, especially the rough and tough ones to preserve our faith. I have read the Book a few times, particularly in those moments when God appeared silent and distant from me, when I was passing through some of the worst storms and turbulence of my life's journey. What God tells Job today stands out for all of us to consider seriously: "The Lord addressed Job out of the storm and said: who shut within doors the sea when it burst forth from the womb; when I made the clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling bands?"

Then, after what God told Job in the last chapter of the Book, he responds, "I know that you can do all things and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted." The Book of Job is summarized in those few verses of Mark's Gospel. Jesus is found sleeping in one part of the boat. Perhaps, he is genuinely tired after a hard day's work of preaching, teaching, listening, and healing, as the boat is headed to the other shore to escape the crowd pressing upon Him. A storm arises in that huge lake and the disciples are so terribly frightened that they do not let the master rest for a while. They wake Him up complaining, "Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing?" Of course, Jesus cares for them and cares for us. There can be no doubt about that. So, he wakes up and stills the storm. But, soon after, He also asks them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" Like the disciples in the boat, certain situations really rock and toss us, we sometimes wonder about the absence of God or think God has gone to sleep, much like Jesus who slept in the boat when it was rocking in the storm. In the Book of Job and throughout the Gospels, the faith of individuals and people is not only always praised, but also affirmed. God never abandons us; though at times it might appear that He is silent or distant from us. What the world needs, particularly those who have problems in life, is rock-solid faith like that of Job, to say to God, 'I know that you can do all things, and no one can thwart your purpose.' "Faith is first of all a personal adherence to God. At the same time, it is a free assent to the whole truth that God has revealed" (CCC150). Fr Johny Edapulavan CMI

FAITH MATTERS: St Thomas More, a Martyr of His Time 1478-1535

St Thomas More was a Catholic Lawyer and Judge in England during the turbulent times of the Protestant Reformation. He was also a social philosopher, author and statesman during the reign of King Henry VIII when it became a difficult time to be a Catholic let alone one who opposed the King and his divorces and remarriages.

More believed firmly in the primacy of the Pope as the successor to St Peter and he opposed the Divine Right of Kings as adopted by many monarchs. He bitterly opposed the Protestant theology of Martin Luther, Tyndale and others and refused to acknowledge Henry VIII as head of the Church. He opposed the annulment of Henry's marriage to Catherine of Aragon and the Queenship of Anne Boleyn following her marriage to Henry.

His early political life before the protestant conflict was distinguished and he held high positions as Privy Counsellor, Diplomat to Rome, Speaker of the House of commons and Lord Chancellor as well as being a secretary and personal advisor to Henry VIII.

He conducted a vigorous campaign against Protestants and is said to have overseen the torture and burning of these at a time when they were regarded as heretics.

More was a man ahead of his time in promoting the education of women and promoting them into places of influence. He spoke truth to power and sacrificed his high position and honours in opposing what he truly believed to be wrong even in the face of persecution death.

He was ultimately martyred for his opposition to the King and canonized in 1935.

We pray: Lord, give us the courage and tenacity to speak truth to power even in the face of overwhelming odds and to declare the Kingship of Christ even unto death.

SYNOD24 marks the Implementation Phase of the Fifth Plenary Council. Since 2018 our Australian church has been asking the question: "What is the Holy Spirit asking of us at this time?". Through listening, dialogue and discernment your voices have been heard and captured through Fifth Plenary Council Decrees. Now it is time to move our Archdiocese into action.

"How can we be a more co-responsible church on mission?"
On September 6th and 7th and October 11th and 12th of 2024, the Archdiocese of Brisbane will celebrate a Synod to mark the next phase of the Plenary Council journey, the Implementation Phase.

Our Archdiocesan Synod will discern the practical and Spirit-led actions that we, as the Archdiocese of Brisbane, need to undertake in the Implementation Phase of the Plenary Council. Bearing in mind that the Decrees have yet to be officially approved by the Apostolic See, these actions will be practical and able to be implemented immediately.

The Synod Engagement Team, and the Synod Writing will engage in strategic consultations with key stake holders, community members and Church agencies. Guided by the question: "How can we be a more co-responsible church on mission?", these consultations will help discern creative dreaming and actionable ideas about what is already happening within the Archdiocese that should be affirmed, what lessons can be learned from others, and where the gaps and needs are.


