# St Peter: Our Patron Ordinary to be Extraordinary. 30th June 2024

**Readings:** Acts 12:1-11 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18 Matthew 16:13-19

John W. Gardner says, "Excellence is doing ordinary things extraordinarily well." Simon Peter was a simple fisherman when Jesus met him. Throughout Peter's three-year journey with Jesus, he had his moments of consolation and doubts. When Jesus appeared to the disciples, walking on water, Peter had enough faith to get out of the boat and come to Jesus. However, once he started having doubts, his faith began to shake, and he allowed himself to sink.

On the night of Christ's crucifixion, when asked if he knew Jesus, Peter denied knowing him not once but three times. Prior to this denial, "He said to him, 'Lord, I am prepared to go to prison and to die with you.' But Jesus replied, 'I tell you, Peter, before the cock crows this day, you will deny me three times".

Made for Greatness: Despite all of Peter's shortcomings and failures, Jesus saw the best in him and made him the first leader. "I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven".

God used ordinary people to do great things. David: "But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for God sees not as man sees, for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." Moses: "Oh, my Lord, I am not eloquent, either in the past or since you have spoken to your servant, but I am slow of speech and of tongue", Jeremiah: "Oh, by the way, they won't listen to you Jeremiah." I thought, that's a hard mission field to be called into. Jeremiah did the best he could because God told him, "Do not say, 'I am only a youth'; for to all to whom I send you, you shall go, and whatever I command you, you shall speak. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, declares the Lord". 'Behold, I have put my words in your mouth", Paul: The biggest persecutor of the church became her biggest missionary. The apostle Peter is an example of how God used a simple man to advance His kingdom and glory. In Acts 4:13, "When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished, and they took note that these men had been with Jesus."

Thomas Edison was one of the world's great geniuses. While creating the light bulb, he failed over several hundred times before he got it right! Someone asked him how it feels to fail that many times, and he responded by saying, "They were not failures, they were education."

These simple people were available to God. They saw where God was working, and they joined Him in that work. Clementina van der Walt said, "My intention is to 'seek the sacred in the ordinary." I wish you the blessings of our Patron's Day and may God bless each one of us through the intercession of St. Peter.

#### **FAITH MATTERS: Sts Peter and Paul**

This weekend we celebrate the feasts of St Peter and St Paul, who together oversaw the establishment and spread of Christ's church on Earth. In this short paragraph I will talk about Paul's writings and main teachings – The Resurrection and Living in Christ.

The Resurrection, Paul contended, was the fulfillment of all of God's plans and promises for Israel. All of salvation history was concretized and established by it. All of the covenants, the Law of Moses, the writings of the many prophets, the longing of patriarchs, kings, shepherds, and so many others found ratification in Jesus rising from the dead. The Resurrection was the dawn of a new creation, the eighth day. "The seventh day completes the first creation," the Catechism explains, "The eighth day begins the new creation. Thus, the work of creation culminates in the greater work of redemption. The first creation finds its meaning and its summit in the new creation in Christ, the splendour of which surpasses that of the first creation" In the words of Paul: "Therefore, if any one is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away, behold, the new has come" A short and simple phrase that helps us more fully appreciate and comprehend Paul's theological vision is en Christo: "in Christ." It appears often in Paul's writings, and it suggests mystical participation, the sharing in the being of something—or someone. Paul taught that the risen Jesus, who bears and fulfills God's promises to all who believe, possesses a dynamis—that is, power.

Those who had entered into the covenants of Abraham, Moses, and David had entered into communion with God in a special way. But those who enter into the new covenant in Christ enter into the very divine life of God and are made truly alive. "For as in Adam all die," wrote Paul, "so also in Christ shall all be made alive". Paul summarised this by saying, "For me to live is Christ." (*Phillipians 1:12*)
